Reminders to Parents Dropping off and Picking up Students



- **1 –** School Doors open at 8:35am. Please do not send your children to school before 8:35am as there are no teachers on supervision and children will have to wait outside.
- **2** Do not drop off your children on the East side of Railway Avenue. Elementary kids are small and even though they are supposed to look both ways and watch for cars, we all know they do not always remember to do so. Please drop off / pick up your children where they do not have to cross the road using the West Railway Avenue side of the road only. If you are running late when dropping off your child, please drop them off at the Main Office Doors as they need to check-in at the office.
- **3** Remember bus safety! Do not ever pass a stopped school bus. Our bus drop off / pick up is 1st Street, so between the times of 8:30 to 8:45 and 3:00 to 3:20 the street is closed to public traffic.

The Division believes the use of video cameras on school buses will enhance the safe operation of its school buses. Video cameras will enable school bus drivers to focus on the safe operation of the bus while improving student passenger identification procedures for disciplinary, medical emergency and other related purposes. Not all NWSD buses are equipped with video cameras, those that are, have signage at the front and back of the bus.






Edsby

School Cash Online & Student Fees - Mrs. Troesch



School Cash Online is up & running. If you don't have an account you can go onto www.schoolcashonline.com and register. You will need you child's student ID number, which you can obtain from the office at (306) 397-2944. Once you are logged in, you can pay your child's student fees.

Kindergarten to Grade 6 fees are \$10.00 for cultural fees which help to cover guest speakers & presentations we have throughout the year.

Grade 7 fees include the same cultural fee, as well as Home Ec supplies, Babysitting Course & Industrial Arts fees.

Grade 8 to 12 fees include the \$10.00 cultural fee, Home Ec & Industrial Arts fees which will help cover consumable supplies for your child throughout the year. If your child is in grade 10-12 & does not take Home Ec or Industrial Arts, your fees are adjusted accordingly on school cash.
