Game Club – Mr. Radke

Hello! my name is Mr. Radke, and I am pleased to announce that this year for the first time we are going to be running a video game design club.

When is Game Club?

Game Club will be starting on September 13th after school and is open to students in Grades 6-10. It will roughly run for one hour every Friday. We aim to start at 3:15 pm and run until around 4:15 pm. We will meet in the computer lab.

What will we be doing?

The first day, the 13th will be a learning how to setup our working environment. We will be working within Scratch. Scratch is a powerful programming language, that is commonly known as block programming. It is a very visual language and is very easy for beginners to pick up, and very easy for intermediate programmers to expand and build very cool software.

After the first day, we will be exploring the world of Game Design. We will be building games together. In order to do this, we need to learn how to become game developers. We will take a look at different games around us, learn about mechanics of games, what makes games fun, and learn how to capture a player's attention. To do this, we will be playing games to understand what makes them fun! We will be hosting a board game session where kids can bring their favorite board games to play with other Game Club members.

Eventually, after we have learned a bit about how to make games, we will transition into working on more in-depth video games on scratch. We will host a game jam in December. A Game Jam is an event where game developers work on their games for a period of time, then at the end, showcase their games to their family and friends to play and enjoy.

What do I need?

So long as you have access to your school email, we can sign up and create Scratch accounts. However, if there are issues, we will also require that students bring a USB stick as well. This way we can transfer work done at Game Club to their USB sticks.

I look forward to working with you all this school year, I am excited to see what kind of games we can make!





School Cash Online & Student Fees – Mrs. Troesch



School Cash Online is up & running. If you don't have an account you can go onto www.schoolcashonline.com and register. You will need you child's student ID number, which you can obtain from the office at (306) 397-2944. Once you are logged in, you can pay your child's student fees.

Kindergarten to Grade 6 fees are \$10.00 for cultural fees which help to cover guest speakers & presentations we have throughout the year.

Grade 7 fees include the same cultural fee, as well as Home Ec supplies, Babysitting Course & Industrial Arts fees.

Grade 8 to 12 fees include the \$10.00 cultural fee, Home Ec & Industrial Arts fees which will help cover consumable supplies for your child throughout the year. If your child is in grade 10-12 & does not take Home Ec or Industrial Arts, your fees are adjusted accordingly on school cash.


Community Wide Pancake Breakfast - School Community Council

What is Cool Kids?

It is a structured 10-session program that teaches children (ages 7-17 years), and their parents, how to better manage a child's anxiety.



CBT

An active, solutionfocused therapy, that involves learning new



Practical Skills

Opportunity to practice new skills in-session, before applying them to real life situations



Parent Participation

Treatment outcomes are significantly improved when parents & caregivers attend sessions with their children



- Registration will be on going, and session start dates may vary

- The program is delivered both online and in person
- Meetings will be one and a half hours long, once a week, over a ten week period
- To attend virtually a device that allows video conferencing is required for each participant.

Why Cool Kids Program?

The cool kids program is a researched group therapy approach to aid children, youth and caregivers with the essential tools to manage anxiety.



Take-home skills to practice during program, provides participants with opportunities to strengthen resiliency



A hybrid approach allows for program flexibility to meet the needs of each participant.



Group benefits include learning from others experiences and added peer support



Cool Kids is run by two practitioners, which means double the support and insight
